PROJECT UPDATE

Salt Creek Wind Farm continues to meet expectations when it comes to generation and availability, and has continued to operate smoothly during its fifth year of operation. Over the last 12 months, the wind farm has generated 136 GWh, which is equivalent to:



Powering approx. 22,000 households per year



Removing approx. 130,000 tonnes of greenhouse gases from the atmosphere – the equivalent of removing 61,000 cars from the road

COMPLIANCE ACTIVITIES

The Environment Protect Authority (EPA) is currently reviewing our Noise Management Plan in accordance with Victoria's noise regulations.



The Environmental Management Plan (EMP) has been reviewed and updated to the status of the Project and in accordance with changes to legislation, standards, and techniques. Tilt provided Moyne Shire Council the EMP review, which includes the proposed updates.

The second round of the Grey-headed Flying-fox (GHFF) Grant Program is open, with invitations to Victoria's GHFF camps sent. Applications close in January 2024.

BENEFIT SHARING

Salt Creek Wind Farm Lend a Hand Fund - Successful Recipients

The Salt Creek Wind Farm, Lend A Hand Community Benefit Fund is open for applications all year round. The Fund distributes \$10,000 annually and will do so for the life of the wind farm. Funds that aren't allocated are rolled into the next year.



In 2023, the Salt Creek Lend a Hand Community Benefit Fund enabled a number of community groups to realise their projects or initiatives. The Hexham Recreation Reserve Committee is one of the recipients. Funds were used to purchase base material for horse yards, providing a safe surface for horses when they are not competing in events.

If you have a community project that is within the region surrounding the Salt Creek Wind Farm, you may be eligible for funding.

Carey Grammar site visit

In August 2023, we had the pleasure of hosting 45 Year 8 students from Carey Baptist Grammar School for a second time. In 2022, we hosted them at Salt Creek Wind Farm, however this year we hosted them at our Dundonnell Wind Farm. During the visit, the students learned about wind turbine operations and the significance of clean, renewable energy. They were also surprised to learn that wind energy is the most efficient energy source and that wind energy projects are helping the economy by creating jobs and lowering electricity prices.

The highlight of the visit was a tour inside a turbine, which gave the students a unique perspective on how wind turbines work. The students also noted the need for turbine blade recycling in the future and were pleased to learn that researchers have made incredibly positive advancements on this issue.
