#### **Project update:**

Newsletter Edition 32 August 2022 The Dundonnell Wind Farm is now fully operational! This makes it Tilt Renewables' and Victoria's largest operating wind farm. This achievement comes on the back of a journey lasting over a decade where we, in partnership with our host landholders, delivery partners and local and state government have taken the project from planning, into construction and now operation. We would like to thank each and every member of the community for your support and patience in getting to this point.

### Community fund applications now open

The next round of funding for the Project opens on the 1st of September with the Fund Committee accepting applications up to the 31st of October 2022. Thinking of applying? Here are some tips from the committee to help with your application.

**Clearly describe the benefit.** Be clear and concise about the benefits to the community. Ensure the application is complete with all supporting documentation provided. Organisations that can demonstrate prior fundraising are well received by the committee.

**Focusing on the local community.** The eight successful applications from the last round covered different areas such as social, sporting, historical, safety and environmental but were all clear about the benefit a grant would bring to the local community.

### Improving community mental health and safety

In addition to the community fund, Tilt Renewables continues working to help improve community mental health and safety. Key initiatives to date include:

- funding a **dedicated staff member** for 10 years for a regional suicide prevention program
- contributing \$500,000 towards the construction of **safe housing** for local domestic violence victims and their families
- establishing a road safety fund to address local traffic issues

Together we are working with providers to build on these initiatives so that they make a lasting change for some of the most vulnerable people in our community.

# The return of the Eastern Quoll

Early this month, the Tilt Renewables team had the incredible opportunity to witness the release of eight female eastern quolls at the Tiverton Farm located next door to Dundonnell Wind Farm. The sanctuary is located on a working merino-sheep farm and is managed by the Odonata Foundation, a conservation-based organisation whose programs are designed to halt and reverse the extinction of key species.

The eastern quoll became extinct on the Australian mainland in the 1950s, so these quolls were bred from populations throughout Tasmania that possessed the best genes.

This was a massive milestone for Odonata and its partners, and a really big deal for the species.

In about six months, once the females and their babies have a chance to settle and grow a little more, several males will be released, the cycle of life will continue and hopefully the population will thrive.
