Snowtown Wind Farm 1 operations

Over the past 12 months, Snowtown 1 produced an output of 290.47 GWh worth of clean energy, meaning that nearly 101,000 tonnes of CO2 that could have been produced by thermal electricity generation was not emitted into the atmosphere.

The total energy produced was enough to power over 48,000 South Australian homes or equivalent of removing 47,000 cars off the road.

Snowtown Wind Farm 2 operations

Over the past 12 months, Snowtown 2 produced enough clean energy to power over 231,000 South Australian homes and 536 kilotonnes of CO2 were offset from its renewable energy generation.

Compliance reporting has been submitted for this financial year and the Climate Change Impact Assessment has been completed with an action plan created for identified improvement, including emissions reductions.

Snowtown Lend a Hand Fund

The Snowtown Wind Farm Lend a Hand Foundation program is a community benefit fund that provides funds to community projects and initiatives in the local area. The program is administered by an independent, locally based community group. Across 2022 and 2023, the Lend a Hand Foundation Fund supported a variety of community programs and initiatives.
