At a glance

- 150m rotors – the largest installed anywhere in Australia
- 189m blade tip height
- 4.2MW generators
- 55km of access track
- 67km of 33kV underground cabling
- 134 x 220kV poles spanning 38km; 114km of conductor strung
- New 500/220kV and 220/33kV Substations
- 60,000m³ of concrete
- 5,300 tonnes of reinforcing steel
- 400 tower sections
- 240 blades
- 80 nacelles and hubs
- 65,000+ hours by apprentices, trainees and engineering cadets
- 665,000 hours worked to date

Step by step

The \$560m Dundonnell Wind Farm and the \$90m transmission connection have been constructed 'on time' following a 600-day schedule.

The Project is now able to test all 80 turbines simultaneously, albeit at a reduced output of 150 MW. This hold point is part of the commissioning sequence required by the Australian Energy Market Operator (AEMO).

With site works nearing completion, focus is on rehabilitation and project close out works.

The on-site quarry rehabilitation works are nearing completion, and there are ongoing works to rehabilitate temporary construction areas along the transmission lines (e.g. revegetation around the base of each pole). AusNet services is managing these works.

COVID-19

While commissioning and rehabilitation works continue on site, specific measures are being implemented to reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19.

Tilt Renewables and contractors are closely monitoring these measures and changes to the wider situation as they develop. The measures put in place will be frequently reviewed and amended as required.



Offsite Landscaping Program

Over the next two months we will commence second-round offers to eligible dwellings to participate in the landscape screening program. Inhabited dwellings within five kilometres of a wind turbine are considered eligible dwellings for the program.

An initial site visit by Tilt Renewables and a qualified landscape architect will review turbine visibility from the dwelling and if appropriate, a landscape mitigation plan will be developed.

The program will remain open to eligible dwelling owners six months after the wind farm has commenced operating.
